He is the author of *Casualties* of Credit: The English Financial Revolution, 1620-1720, A Philosopher's Economist: Hume and the Rise of Capitalism, together with Margaret Schabas, and, most recently, Scarcity: A History from the Origins of Capitalism to the Climate Crisis, with Fredrik Albritton Jonsson.
